Minutes of MEDA Business Meeting

October 27, 2014 Rocky Gap Lodge Cumberland, MD

MEDA Board President, Lawrence Twele, CEcD, called the meeting to order at 8:18 a.m. and introduced Kimberly Clark, who offered the MEDA Secretary's Report and asked for approval of the minutes from the Summer Conference. A change was noted to the minutes as written. Dominic Murray motioned to accept the edited minutes; Bob Brennan seconded. The edited minutes were approved unanimously as presented.

Daniel Thompson presented 33 new members for approval, which brought MEDA's current membership to 434.
